

### When You Visit a College Campus:

- Make arrangements with the admissions office. Try to visit while college is in session, particularly during weekdays.
- Tour the grounds, facilities, dormitories, and fraternities/ sororities if they interest you.
- Talk to students, especially in your academic areas of interest. Their views may vary widely. You can arrange this through faculty members.
- Visit a classroom and talk with faculty in your area of interest.
- Eat a meal in one of the college dining facilities.
- Visit the coffee shop/snack bar/student union.
- Read the campus newspaper and note the issues discussed.
- Check the student bulletin boards. Find out about clubs and social activities.
- Attend a social, athletic, or cultural event on campus.
- Stay overnight in a dorm.
- Take notes and pick up catalogs, brochures, etc. Take photos so you can compare later.
- Have an interview if appropriate.
- Ask for statistics on reported campus crime. Contact Campus Security with questions.
- Visit the library or libraries.
- Find out what kind of assistance is available to students – academically, medically, etc.
